Missional Thirst for God's Desired Future

- "We live in a culture that makes it hard for people to imagine and be led by God"
- Mission not a program; core of the church's identity
- Asking what God is already up to, not only in our congregation, but in the community and world outside of us, and ahead of us
- ► Missional not attractional; life and death issue

Making Space

- Cannot rely on the normal governing process
- "Disruption" created by leaders
- Entering "liminal space"
- Time; change is not punctual

Nurturing a Climate of Discernment

- ► Changing the way we change
- ►Organizational culture—"culture eats strategy for lunch"
- Discernment: desire to reach one mind, "the mind of Christ"
- Consensus: not binary; methods available

Dwelling in the Word

- Specific method: text, respond, listen to the other, share; keep repeating.
- ► The text wants to do something, not just say something
- Not search for answers, but living with questions
- Imbed congregation's story in God's story

Sharing the Journey

- Begins with congregational discovery process
- Discover your particular missional calling one thing
- ► Pain because you are moving forward
- ► Share with other congregations—walk together in covenant
