Leading in Complex Times - Deacon Claire Meyer


Workshop Description: Using Jennifer Garvey Berger's book "Unlocking Leadership Mindtraps: How to Thrive in Complexity" to guide us, we will explore the ways in which we turn in on ourselves when faced with complexity and uncertainty. In addition, each mindtrap is paired with a New Testament text that unlocks a Lutheran theological grounding. Garvey Berger discerns five pernicious and pervasive "mind traps" to frame the book. These are: the desire for simple stories, our sense that we are right, our desire to get along with others in our group, our fixation with control, and our constant quest to protect and defend our egos. In addition to understanding why these natural impulses steer us wrong in a fast-moving world, leaders will get powerful questions and approaches that help them escape these patterns. Participants will discuss how to unlock each mindtrap and walk away with six 30 min devotions that can be shared with councils, teams, and other leaders.

Purchasing the book is not required but is recommended for those who like a quick easy read.

Presenter Bio: Deacon Claire Meyer has been around the church for 20 years in various leadership roles. Intergenerational Worship: The Work of ALL People - Rev Breen Marie Sipes

Workshop Description: What if it is possible to include, involve, and engage all generations, both in worship and in worship leadership? What if worship leadership could be reframed as a generous out-pouring of God's generosity toward us? And what if it's not as hard as it sounds? Join Pastor Breen Sipes as we experience pop-up intergenerational worship together, learn a framework for shifting to this type of worship, and formulate a plan for introducing intergenerational worship in your own context.

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Presenter Bio: Pastor Breen Marie Sipes is a full-time parent and an all-time advocate for intergenerational ministry. She is a board member and facilitator for Music that Makes Community, a guest preacher in small, rural, vibrant congregations, a confirmation curriculum developer, and a volunteer children's faith formation leader at her home church. The Grace and Wisdom of the Enneagram - Rev. Edgar L. Schambach

Workshop Description: Our workshop is designed for persons who would like to discover their Enneagram type and its meaning for their life and ministry. It is also designed for those who would like to move beyond today's popular psychological profiling of the Enneagram to the deeper spiritual context of the Enneagram for which the Enneagram was first developed. The Enneagram is more than an unusual 9-pointed diagram that has sparked popular interest. It is both an instrument for self-study and a body of wisdom for spiritual enlightenment that has roots dating back centuries. What was once an oral tradition has today become codified in books and other social media. The Enneagram remains a powerful tool for growing in self-awareness in the light of God's grace and deepening one's spiritual life. It is also an excellent tool for developing personal leadership and interpersonal skills.

Our workshop will fall into three parts. 1) An overview of key aspects of the Enneagram's nine points and its three triads, touching on key aspects not often found in the popular literature. 2) The Enneagram as a tool for self-understanding and deeper spiritual growth. 3) The Enneagram as a tool for strengthening leadership and inter-relationship skills.

ADVANCE PREPARATION: Those new to the Enneagram are urged to read The Essential Enneagram (revised and updated edition) by David Daniels and Virginia Price (Price range – new \$15, discount and used prices also available on Amazon), which contains a self-administered test to discover one Enneagram type. Those familiar with the Enneagram may want to review some of the literature regarding their type.
