



By Sandra Markle; Illustrated by Howard McWilliam



HOW DO DINOSAURS SAY I'M MAD?





Is God Always with Me? introduces children ages 3–6 to the idea that God is a part of their everyday lives.






ARE YOU MY MOTHER?
