We will determine our own leadership styles and learn how to best use them with opportunities for hands-on practice and peer and self evaluation. Large group worship, Bible Study, fellowship and fun and time for prayer and self reflection will all be a part of this weekend.

### LEADERSHIP SUMMIT 9TH-12TH GRADE MAY 29-31, 2025 LOCATION TBD

This weekend allows us to continue to explore what it means to be a faithful leader. In the fall, we explored how to be leaders in the world. The spring event allows us to think about how we can be leaders IN and FOR the church. What does it mean to be a leader in the church? How do we live out our baptismal promises? How do we advocate, support, worship and pray with and for one another. Join in parts of synod assembly to learn how the church works and how you can be a part of it, and spend time in our own workshops-digging deep into specific areas of interest such as teaching, music, worship and bible study, advocacy or global mission. ### THE JOURNEY 9TH-12TH GRADE JULY 6-12, 2025 NASHVILLE, TN

Travel to Nashville with other high school youth from the Nebraska Synod as we learn to live and work in community. We will learn to use our gifts as we learn about the gifts our neighbors in Tennessee bring to the table. Together, we will serve, laugh, worship and ask questions. Bible study and worship will help us explore who we are as beloved disciples and children of God and what it means to be in community. This is not a vacation, it's a chance to learn, grow and reflect together in a new place that looks different than our own neighborhood. As we engage with others, we will learn more about ourselves and about all God's children.

#### DIG DEEP "POP-UP" EVENTS 6TH-8TH AND 9TH-12TH GRADE

These unique events are opportunities to participate in small group intense learning cohorts focused on taking a deep dive into topics such as accompaniment, advocacy or vocation. These will be weekend or day long events at sites throughout the state depending on the program topic.
