

Nebraska Synod Fall Leadership Gathering 2024 Wednesday Workshops

Workshop #1 - "Understanding Your Role in Life."

Wouldn't it be wonderful if the whole church was released? The church shouldn't be nor can be in the hands of professionals. We talk of anyone approaching God, talking, and listening to God, but we seem only too happy to settle for letting someone else do the talking and listening. Someone holier, better educated, more experienced. God, by the Holy Spirit, has gifted the whole church. That means you. That means me. If the church is the body of Christ, then everyone is involved in the work of the Church. One pastor calls it "potluck Christianity." When we come together, everybody brings something. Then, the meal is rich and plentiful. Everyone feasts. Everyone is grateful for what others have brought to the table. The church isn't a place where people look for something to join, attend, or perform. Rather, the church becomes our calling, our purpose. It has nothing to do with institutions, jobs, or charters. It is the people of God who know who God created them to be and live it. Who celebrate it!

So it is fair to ask, What is my role? What am I called to do? To be?

Join us for a deep dive into the fourth chapter of Ephesians as we explore Paul's understanding of how the church is gifted with five anointings (there's a word we Lutherans don't use much!): Apostles, Prophets, Evangelist, Shepherds, Teachers. Come to be affirmed in who you are! Relax into how God has wired you to serve and be Jesus in the world. (Spoiler! You aren't expected to be everything Jesus was – just be you!). Come to see how you can release God's people in your ministry setting.

As we explore flipping the script, consider with us a new/old vision of the church. We still have leadership, but everybody is involved. Everyone fits into the fivefold ministry roles. Be what God designed you to be! Live in the apportionment of grace given you by Jesus. Wouldn't it be wonderful if the whole church was released?

Workshop #2 - "Come Away and Rest Sacred Space"

He then graduated with a Masters in Spiritual Formation from Portland Seminary at George Fox University in 2020. As a spiritual director, he specializes in clergy care and those who are spiritual but not religious.

David loves serving as Program Director for Seeking the Spirit Within. He and his wife happily live in their new hometown of Fremont, Nebraska with their oldest son and a very cuddly, plush-lop-eared bunny named Jack Fremont.

Workshop #3 - "Having the Tough Conversations: Creating Safe Space Where All Voices Can Be Heard"

Flipping the script isn't easy. And some aren't going to like it. How do we create a space where all voices can be heard and discussion can happen? How do we open the door for tough conversations on religion and politics, religion and social issues, religion and daily life? How do we allow for conversation where it's ok to disagree and all voices are heard, but all are respected as loved children of God?

Join Pastor Carla Christopher and Gretchen Ahrens for this workshop on learning how to create a safe space. We'll cover everything from the basics of what you need to do beforehand and how to create an environment to enter the conversation with a traumainformed mindset and how to ask questions or start the conversation and what to do when the conversation doesn't go as planned. Pastor Carla will provide resources along the way with and we will have breakout rooms to practice our new skills.
