

Gather outside of worship space, candles are lit.

L: Light and peace, in Jesus Christ our Lord.

L: Tonight, we stand with a long tradition of Christians who have acknowledged this night of prayer with our saints. Traditionally celebrated the night before All Saint's Day, tonight is our All Hallow's Eve service. This night has its roots in the Celtic tradition of celebrating the first night of winter. It was a time when the souls of the dead were said to return to their homes. Bonfires were set on hilltops to frighten away evil spirits. As we walk to the cemetery, we remember that, in Christ, the space between us and the saints who have gone before is a thin space.

L: Let us pray.

We give you thanks, O God, for in the beginning, you called light into being, and you set lights in the sky to govern night and day. In a pillar of cloud by day and a pillar of fire by night you led your people into freedom. Illumine the shadows by the light of your Christ; may your Word be a lamp to our feet and a light to our path; for you are merciful, and you love your whole creation, and with all your creatures we give you glory, through your Son Jesus Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever. **Amen.**

Song – ELW #262 - Wait for the Lord (refrain only) (while singing, the assembly processes to the graveyard)

Wait for the Lord whose day is near. Wait for the Lord. Be strong, take heart.

L: The light shines in the darkness

A: And the darkness has not overcome it.

1 Samuel 28:3-25 Reading follows:

Narrator: Now Samuel has died, and all Israel has mourned for him and buried him in Ramah, his own city. Saul had expelled the mediums and the wizards from the land. The Philistines assembled, and came and encamped at Shunem. Saul gathered all Israel, and they encamped at Gilboa. When Saul saw the army of the Philistines, he was afraid, and his heart trembled greatly. When Saul inquired of the Lord, the Lord did not answer him, not by dreams, or by Urim, or by prophets. Then Saul said to his servants...

Saul: Seek out for me a woman who is a medium, so that I may go to her and inquire of her.

Narrator: His servants said to him...

Reader 2: There is a medium at Endor.

Narrator: So, Saul disguised himself and put on other clothes and went there, he and two men with him. They came to the woman by night.

Saul: Consult a spirit for me, and bring up for me the one whom I name to you.

Woman: Surely you know what Saul has done, how he has cut off the mediums and the wizards from the land. Why then are you laying a snare for my life to bring about my death?

Saul: As the Lord lives, no punishment shall come upon you for this thing.

Woman: Whom shall I bring up for you?

Saul: Bring up Samuel for me.

Narrator: When the woman saw Samuel, she cried out with a loud voice...

Woman: You are Saul! Why have you deceived me?

Saul: Have no fear; what do you see?

Woman: I see a divine being coming up out of the ground.

Saul: What is his appearance?

Woman: An old man is coming up; he is wrapped in a robe.

Narrator: So, Saul knew that it was Samuel, and he bowed with his face to the ground, and paid homage.

Samuel: Why have you disturbed me by bringing me up?

Saul: I am in great distress, for the Philistines are warring against me, and God has turned away from me and answered me no more, either by prophets or by dreams; so I have summoned you to tell me what I should do.

Samuel: Why then do you ask me, since the Lord has turned from you and become your enemy? The Lord has done to you just as he spoke by me; for the Lord has torn the kingdom out of your hand, and given it to your neighbor, David. Because you did not obey the voice of the Lord, and did not carry out his fierce wrath against Amalek, therefore the Lord has done this thing to you today. Moreover, the Lord will give Israel along with you into the hands of the Philistines; and tomorrow you and your sons shall be with me; the Lord will also give the army of Israel into the hands of the Philistines.

Narrator: Immediately Saul fell full length on the ground, filled with fear because of the words of Samuel; and there was no strength in him, for he had eaten nothing all day and all night.

Woman: Your servant has listened to you; I have taken my life in my hand, and have listened to what you have said to me. Now therefore, you also listen to your servant; let me set a morsel of bread before you. Eat, that you may have strength when you go on your way.

Saul: I will not eat.

Narrator: But his servants, together with the woman, urged him; and he listened to their words. So, he got up from the ground and sat on the bed. Now the woman had a fatted calf in the house. She quickly slaughtered it, and she took flour, kneaded it, and baked unleavened cakes. She put them before Saul and his servants, and they ate. Then they rose and went away that night.

(silence)

L: Let us pray. Almighty and ever living God, you have made all things in your wisdom and established the boundaries of life and death: Grant that we may obey your voice in this world, and in the world to come may enjoy the rest and peace which you have appointed for your people; through Jesus Christ who is resurrection and life, and who lives and reigns for ever and ever. Amen.

Song – Bless the Lord My Soul

Bless the Lord, my soul. And bless God's holy name. Bless the Lord, my soul. Who leads you into life.

Ezekiel 37:1-14 Reading follows:

Ezekiel: The hand of the Lord came upon me, and he brought me out by the spirit of the Lord and set me down in the middle of a valley; it was full of bones. He led me all around them; there were very many lying in the valley, and they were very dry. The Lord said to me...

The Lord: Mortal, can these bones live?

Ezekiel: O Lord god, you know.

The Lord: Then prophesy to these bones, and say to them: O dry bones, hear the word of the Lord. Thus says the Lord God to these bones: I will cause breath to enter you, and you shall live. I will lay sinews on you, and will cause flesh to come upon you, and cover you with skin, and put breath in you, and you shall live; and you shall know that I am the Lord.

Ezekiel: So, I prophesied as I had been commanded; and as I prophesied, suddenly there was a noise, a rattling, and the bones came together, bone to its bone. I looked, and there were sinews on them, and flesh had come upon them, and skin had covered them; but there was no breath in them.

The Lord: Then prophesy to the breath, prophesy, mortal, and say to the breath: Thus says the Lord God: Come from the four winds, O breath, and breathe upon these slain, that they may live.

Ezekiel: I prophesied as he commanded me, and the breath came into them, and they lived, and stood on their feet, a vast multitude.

The Lord: Mortal, these bones are the whole house of Israel. They say, 'Our bones are dried up, and our hope is lost; we are cut off completely.' Therefore prophesy, and say to them, Thus says the Lord God: I am going to open your graves, and bring you up from your graves, O my people; and I will bring you back to the land of Israel. And you shall know that I am the Lord, when I open your graves, and bring you up from your graves, O my people. I will put my spirit within you, and you shall live, and I will place you on your own soil; then you shall know that I, the Lord, have spoken and will act.

(silence)

L: Let us pray. O God, you have called your people to your service from age to age. Do not give us over to death, but raise us up to serve you, to praise you, and to glorify your holy name; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Francis of Assisi is associated with protection of animals. It's customary for churches to conduct ceremonies blessing animals on or around his feast day, which is October 4th.

Greetings and Prayer

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

And also with you.

Let us pray.

Holy God, we thank you for the gift of life. Recalling Francis of Assisi who celebrated your love for all creation, today we embrace our connectedness to all: to wind, sea, and sky; to earthworm, giraffe, and chicken; to fish and puppy, to cats of the jungle and in our homes. Deepen our care for all that lives; in the name of Jesus, our teacher, savior, and friend. **Amen.**

Readings

The reading of scripture can be done responsively as printed in the bulletin. It is advised to use Genesis 1:1, 20-28 and select one other from the scriptures below.

Genesis 6:17-22 Job 38:1-11, 16-18 Psalm 84:1-4 Psalm 148

Psalm 8

The reading of scripture is followed by silence for reflection. Other forms of reflection may also follow, such as brief commentary, teaching, or personal witness; non-biblical readings; interpretation through music or other art forms; or guided conversation among those present. This is a great time to ask the pet owners/caretakers what they like most about their pets. They usually enjoy talking about their pets and the relationship they have with their animals.

Blessing of Animals

The leader may invite all who have brought pets (or a picture or toy, in the case of those animals who would not find it a blessing to be present) to come forward for a prayer of blessing.

When all have returned to their places, a wider blessing is offered in these or similar words for all animals.

Gracious and loving God, you place all living things into the care of humankind. We pray that companionship with household and outside pets will deepen our care for animals everywhere. Help us to balance our needs with theirs, and lead us in ways of life together that will be sustainable for all. We pray in Jesus' name.

Amen.

This service is followed by pet treats being distributed to the animals – dog treats and cat treats. If larger or different animals are in attendance, you may want to find out ahead of time and have carrots, apples, or whatever the owner advices.

Finally, the humans can be fed! Hot "dogs" and cat "whisker" cookies are fun refreshments.

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Chalking the Door

Since the Middle Ages, chalking the door is a tangible way to honor God in our lives during Epiphany. Chalking the door is a way of marking our church and/or home with sacred signs and symbols as we ask God's blessing upon those who live, work, or visit throughout the coming year.

The first and last numbers simply refer to the current year. The letters C M B come from the traditional names for the three wise men: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. Some also suggest "Christus Mansionem Benedicat" which means, "May Christ bless this dwelling!" The two crosses connect the symbols.

It's easy to make this happen. First, gather the congregation or household. If you live alone, consider asking a neighbor to help. Second, follow the below liturgy and select one or two of the prayers below. Finally, write the inscription using chalk and taking turns, make the following inscription above the outside of the front door. This inscription can also be placed on a wooden sign next to the door.

Liturgy and Prayers for Chalking the Door

Leader: Peace be to this house, and to all who enter here.

People: Amen.

One or more of the following prayers maybe said:

May all who come to our church or home this year rejoice to find Christ living among us; and may we seek and serve, in everyone we meet, that same Jesus who is your incarnate Word, now and forever. Amen.

God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only-begotten One to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this church or house and all who inhabit it. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Savior. Amen.

Loving God, bless this congregation or household. May we be blessed with health, goodness of heart, gentleness, and abiding in your will. We ask this through Christ our Savior. Amen.

As participants take turns making the inscription, the leader says:

The three Wise Men, Caspar [C], Melchior [M], and Balthasar [B] followed the star to Bethlehem and the child Jesus two thousand [20], and twenty-five years ago [25]. May Christ bless our home [+], and remain with us throughout the new year [+]. Amen.

20 + C M B + 25

Conclude with all saying the Lord's Prayer.

They were at the tomb early this morning, ²³ and when they did not find his body there they came back and told us that they had indeed seen a vision of angels who said that he was alive. ²⁴ Some of those who were with us went to the tomb and found it just as the women had said, but they did not see him." ²⁵ Then he said to them, "Oh, how foolish you are and how slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have declared! ²⁶ Was it not necessary that the Messiah should suffer these things and then enter into his glory?" ²⁷ Then beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he interpreted to them the things about himself in all the scriptures.

Maundy Thursday/Foot Washing and Hand Washing

In biblical times, foot washing was not done by the host of the meal, but rather by the workers of the household. When Jesus washed his disciples' feet, it was a radical act of humility. You may stand at the font and receive a hand washing, a sign of God's blessing for your service. You may also utilize sanitation wipes to wipe the hands of another person, and then that person can return the act of humility.

Prayer Stations

Prayers in the Sand

"I looked, and a hand was stretched out to me, and a written scroll was in it. He spread it before me; it had writing on the front and on the back, and written on it were words of lamentation and mourning and woe." – Ezekiel 2:9-10

Our lamentations, mourning, and woes are not so easy to admit. We hide our wants and needs- perhaps rightfully so. Understandably, we don't always feel so comfortable writing our prayers on scrolls. But in this sand, we can seek help, ask questions, and display our grievances then erase the lines drawn in the sand. At this station, consider letting go of the things weighing you down-the questions, prayers, and thoughts so heavy on your heart. Afterwards, we invite you to erase your lines in the sand, giving the weight to God.

Around the World

"We know that the whole creation has been groaning in labor pains until now; And not only creation, but we ourselves, Who have the first fruits of the Spirit, Groan inwardly while we wait for adoption, The redemption of our bodies."

– Romans 8: 22-23

Let us pray for the nations of the world, pleading for mercy and healing for those places and peoples torn by ancient animosities or terrorized by new fears; those devastated by drought or disease; those crushed by poverty, oppression, or war; and those consumed by power, wealth or greed.

Come, you who long for peace among nations and between peoples, peace in our homes and our hearts. Come as you are to pray. You are invited to use the tapers to light the candles, and place one or more candles on the map to reflect your prayers.

Reflections

"I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made." – Psalm 139

Looking into the mirror we see ourselves for who we are. At this station, you may take the time to reflect on the whole of God's creation, which includes you. At this station you will also find the bible open to Psalm 139 allowing you to further reflect on the author's words and what they mean to you and the world around us (please leave it open for the next person).

Tie Blankets

"For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many.

– Mark 10:45

As Christians, we are called to serve others just as Jesus did. At this station, you are invited to serve members of the Lincoln community by making a tie blanket which will be donated to Barnabas. The Barnabas Community offers free clothing, books, toys, household goods — and hope and hospitality — to all that walk through its doors. By donating tie blankets, we will be providing warmth and comfort to our neighbors in their times of need. To help in the making of the tie blanket, lay the blanket out flat and begin on one side. To attach the top piece of fleece to the bottom piece of fleece, tie the strips of fleece together in a double knot. Continue tying the pieces of fleece together until you have worked your way all around the blanket.

Taking your Prayers to the Cross

"Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light."

– Matthew 11:28-30

We are called to take our joys, hopes, worries, anxieties, <u>all</u> our prayers, to the cross. Whether you are carrying heavy burdens or celebrating joys, Jesus is with you always. At this station, you are invited to write your prayers on a ribbon and tie it to the cross. Know that your prayers are heard and known by God.

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

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
Taizé Service of Prayer Leader's Guide




